At our school, we aim to provide exceptional Wrap-Around-Care for our Primary students, ensuring a safe and nurturing environment outside of regular school hours. This policy outlines our commitment to delivering high-quality care that meets the expectations set by the relevant school inspectorate based on the 2014 National Curriculum in England.

Opening Hours

Our Breakfast Club and Wrap-Around-Care provision operates from:

• Before School: 8:00 am to 8:45 am

After School: 3:15 pm to 5:30 pm

Safeguarding and Welfare

We prioritise the safeguarding and welfare of all children in our care. Our rigorous safeguarding procedures include:

- Conducting enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) checks for all staff members.
- Ensuring all staff members receive regular training on safeguarding and child protection.
- Implementing robust policies and procedures for reporting and managing safeguarding concerns, promoting a culture of vigilance.
- Appointing a designated safeguarding lead (DSL) who is responsible for overseeing safeguarding practices and acting as a point of contact for staff, parents, and carers.

Development and Learning

We believe in maintaining continuity between the school day and our Wrap-Around-Care provision. To support children's development and learning,

we:

- Provide opportunities for child-led play, promoting creativity, problemsolving, and critical thinking skills.
- Offer a range of structured activities, including sports, arts and crafts, music, and outdoor play.
- Foster positive relationships through group activities and team-building exercises.
- Support homework completion, providing a calm and supportive environment for children to focus on their tasks.
- Encourage children to reflect on their experiences, share their thoughts, and express their feelings.

Activities

Our Wrap-Around-Care provision offers a diverse range of activities to ensure children are engaged and motivated. These include:

- Sports and physical activities, promoting fitness and overall well-being.
- Arts and crafts, encouraging creativity and self-expression.
- Music and drama, fostering cultural appreciation and confidence.
- Outdoor play, allowing children to explore nature and develop gross motor skills.
- Board games and puzzles, enhancing critical thinking and problem-solving abilities.
- Quiet areas for reading, relaxation, and independent study.

Parent and Carer Partnership
